What is microchipping and how does it work?

A simple procedure where your veterinarian inserts a microchip the size of a grain of rice beneath your pet's skin as a permanent ID. If your dog or cat gets lost and the chip is scanned, the microchip registry database where you registered will contact you and help you reunite with them!



1. Veterinarian inserts microchip under your pet's skin



2. Owner registers chip via microchip registry database



3. Lost pet gets scanned at local shelter or veterinary clinic



4. Owner is contacted and reunited with dog or cat!

Is microchipping worth it?

The proof is in the pets returned home!

- Approximately 10 million pets are lost in the United States each year.*
- Microchipped dogs are more than 2x as
 likely to be reunited with their owners, while
 microchipped cats are more than 20x as
 likely to be reunited.**
